

Construction and Demolition Debris (C&D)

Construction and demolition debris (C&D) is defined as discarded materials generally considered to be not water soluble and non-hazardous in nature from the construction or destruction of a structure as part of a construction or demolition project or from the renovation of a structure, including such debris from construction of structures at a site remote from the construction or demolition project site. Scrap from manufacturing facilities is the type of material generally used in construction projects and that would meet the definition of construction and demolition debris if it were generated as part of a construction or demolition project.

Acceptable Wastes

Items comprised of a building / structure that are permanent and fixed.

Metals – Beams, Aluminum, Copper, Stainless	Glass and Mirrors – Windows/Doors, ect
Brick, Concrete, Asphalt, Stone	Cardboard, Paper, Plastic, Wood, Fabric, Styrofoam, Fiberglass
Gypsum wallboard, Hardie Board	Lumber & Pallets
Plumbing - Piping and Fixtures	A/C Ducting and Insulation
Roofing & Siding Materials	Flooring Materials
Electrical – Wires and Fixtures (no circuit boards)	Buckets or Containers - Dry
Rocks, Soils, Tree remains, Trees, Vegetative Matter	Yard Trash or Land Clearing Debris
Fencing, Decking, Marine Dock – Untreated	Pools

Materials approved by the Department, that are not expected to produce leachate that poses a threat to public health or the environment.

Utility Poles

Industrial Manufacturing Wastes. Must be approved by FDEP prior.
